#### **Project News**

In this newsletter issue, we would like to take the opportunity to introduce our readers to the main objectives and activities of the SAHYOG project focussing on EU-India research cooperation in the fields of biomass production and bio-waste conversion.

## **SAHYOG Activities**

Main activities of the SAHYOG project include:

- Elaboration of **inventories on important research themes**, as well as on **research programmes and projects** in the area of biomass and bio-waste.
- Elaboration of a Strategic Research Agenda (SRA) to facilitate concerted planning of future EU-India research initiatives in the area of biomass and bio-waste.
- Definition of a Roadmap identifying key targets to scale up EU-India collaborations.

- **Twinning of projects** from India and Europe in order to ensure exchange of information, data, materials and methods.
- Short-term exchanges of junior and senior researchers based on transparent calls for proposals for young talents and senior experts from India and Europe.
- Organisation of summer schools in Europe and India involving renowned international lecturers.
- Organisation of several **stakeholder workshops** and a **final SAHYOG conference** to ensure widespread communication of project activities and results.

#### SAHYOG Kick-off Meeting in Brussels

Project activities were launched in January 2012 with the SAHYOG kick-off meeting at the ENEA – EU Liaison Office in Brussels. The work programme of the upcoming 3 project years was fine-tuned and good foundations were laid for a fruitful cooperation of all SAHYOG partners with the aim to strengthen EU-India research cooperation in the fields of biomass and bio-waste.

#### SAHYOG Expert Meeting in Bruges

This international meeting between SAHYOG partners and experts from Europe and India was organized on 10 May 2012 as a side event of the conference i-SUP 2012 - International Conference on Innovation and Sustainable Production, 6-9 May 1012, Bruges, Belgium.

The aim of this meeting was to discuss the templates used for data collection for the SAHYOG inventories of biomass/bio-waste production and biomass research projects. This provided an opportunity to improve the methodology, identify missing links and streamline the inventorisation process in India and Europe.

Apart from the project partners, experts have been invited from European and Indian funding agencies, industries, agriculture producers, as well as other biomass projects and existing international biomass networks.

## SAHYOG at the Indo-European Research and Innovation Partnership conference

200 European and Indian stakeholders from the public and private sectors gathered in Brussels on 31 May – 1 June 2012 to discuss common challenges, priority areas and instruments for enhanced Europe-India cooperation in research and innovation. Máire Geoghegan-Quinn, the European Commissioner for Research, Innovation and Science and Shri Vilasrao Deshmukh, the Indian Minister of Science and Technology and Earth Sciences addressed the conference, which provided an occasion for showcasing existing opportunities and good practices in Europe-India cooperation.

Following the EU-India Joint Declaration on Research and Innovation Cooperation in February 2012, this Conference was the first step in moving up a gear to build an Indo-European research and innovation partnership, with larger scale, scope and impact focusing on common challenges and enhanced synergies.

SAHYOG was represented by the coordinator Dr. Neeta Sharma, ENEA Research Centre Trisaia, Italy and Dr. Ludo Diels, VITO, Belgium in the **thematic session on bio-economy** (including optimization of agricultural systems, exploitation of bio-wastes) which aimed at identifying priorities for future EU-India cooperation and making recommendations on concrete actions to scale up the Indo-European Research and Innovation Partnership.
